 - c) Briefly discuss endometrial preparation options for third party parenting and cryopreserved embryo transfer. (40)

- 2 a) Discuss the reproductive, obstetrical and perinatal outcomes of women with endometriosis including adenomyosis. (40)
 - b) Discuss the role of Levothyroxine supplementation on pregnancy loss and preterm birth in women with subclinical hypothyroidism. (20)
 - Approximately 30% of postmenopausal women have osteoporosis and at least 40% of these women will sustain a fragility fracture. Discuss the management of fracture risk amongst peri- and postmenopausal women.

 - c) Briefly discuss Pre-IVF treatment of uterine cavity defects: The do's and don'ts. (20)
