### Instructions to Authors

#### 1. MANUSCRIPTS

- 1.1 All copies should be typewritten with double spacing and wide margins.
- 1.2 In addition to the hard copy, material should also, if possible, be sent on disk (in text only format) to facilitate and expedite the setting of the manuscript.
- 1.3 Abbreviations should be spelt out when first used in the text. Scientific measurements should be expressed in SI units throughout, with two exceptions: blood pressure should be given in mmHg and haemoglobin as g/dl.
- 1.4 All numerals should be written as such (ie not spelt out) except at the beginning of a sentence.
- 1.5 Tables, references and legends for illustrations should be typed on separate sheets and should be clearly identified. Tables should carry Roman numerals, thus: I, II, III, etc and illustrations should have Arabic numerals, thus: 1, 2, 3 etc.
- 1.6 The author's contact details should be given on the title page, ie telephone, mobile, fax numbers, and e-mail address.

#### 2. FIGURES

- 2.1 Figures consist of all material which cannot be set in type, such as photographs, line drawings, etc. (Tables are not included in this classification and should not be submitted as photographs). Photographs should be glossy prints, not mounted, untrimmed and unmarked. Where possible, all illustrations should be of the same size, using the same scale.
- 2.2 Figure numbers should be clearly marked with a sticker on the back and the top of the illustration should be indicated.

2.3 Where identification of a patient is possible from a photograph the author must submit consent to publication signed by the patient, or the parent or guardian in the case of a minor.

#### 3. REFERENCES

- 3.1 References should be inserted in the text as superior numbers and should be listed at the end of the article in numerical order.
- 3.2 References should be set out in the Vancouver style and the abbreviations of journals should conform to those used in Index Medicus.

Names and initials of all authors should be given unless there are more than six, in which case the first three names should be given followed by "et al". First and last page numbers should be given.

3.3 "Unpublished observations" and "personal communications" may be cited in the text, but not as references.

### UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG's) Revisited



My editorial in the Transactions edition 59 (2) of 2015 titled **"From Millennium Development Goals to Sustainable Development Goals – Are we ready"**, presented a historical perspective of the achievements and failures of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). I further focused on MDGs 4 and 5 as the South African Department of Health committed

substantial resources in trying to achieve these goals.

For MDG4 target of reducing under-five child mortality, South Africa did not meet the target of 20 per 1000 live births. It only managed to reduce mortality from 61 per 1000 live births in 1990 to 45 per 1000 live births at the end of 2014. The commonest causes of under-five child mortality are preventable diseases such as HIV/AIDS, which accounted for 17% of under-five deaths, while pneumonia accounted for 14% despite the availability of the pneumococcal vaccine in the Expanded Programme on Immunization (EPI).<sup>1</sup> MDG5 of improving maternal health was not different as the goal was to reduce maternal mortality by three quarters by 2015.

South Africa achieved a minimal drop from 150 per 100,000 live births in 1990 to 140 per 100 000 live births by the end of 2014, against the expected target of 38 per 100 000 live births by October 2015. The risk of maternal mortality remains highest for adolescent girls under 15 years old and complications in pregnancy and childbirth are the leading causes of death among adolescent girls in developing countries.<sup>2</sup> In South Africa, a significant proportion of maternal deaths occurs in teenage pregnancies accounting for 36% of maternal deaths.<sup>1</sup>

We fast forward to May 2018 and ask the question: What has the UN achieved since the launch of the SDGs in September 2015?

It is important to remind ourselves that the specific SDG applicable to health is SDG3.

The latter states to: "Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages" and set some new goals as follows:

- 3.1 By 2030, reduce the global maternal mortality ratio to less than 70 per 100,000 live births (previous by three quarters)
- 3.2 By 2030, end preventable deaths of new-borns and children under 5 years of age, with all countries aiming to reduce neonatal mortality to at least as low as 12 per 1,000 live births and under-5 mortality to at least as low as 25 per 1,000 live births (Previous by two-thirds)

The 2017 UN global report on SDG3 was disappointing to say the least as very little progress was made in achieving the targets under the various SDGs. It reported that in 2015, the global maternal mortality ratio stood at 216 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births. This fell below the target of less than 70 maternal deaths by 2030 and to accomplish the latter, it required an annual rate of reduction of at least 7.5 per cent, more than double the annual rate of progress achieved from 2000 to 2015. However, in 2016, 78 per cent of live births worldwide benefited from skilled care during delivery, compared to 61 per cent in 2000.

In sub-Saharan Africa, however, the rate in 2016 was only 53 per cent of live births. In terms of the target for mortality rate for children under 5 years of age, globally it was 43 deaths per 1,000 live births in 2015. The rate represents a 44 percent reduction since 2000. Mortality among children under 5 years of age remains high in sub-Saharan Africa, with a rate of 84 deaths per 1,000 live births in 2015.<sup>3</sup>

With reference to South Africa, what has been the progress with SDG3 related to maternal mortality and deaths in children under 5 years of age since September 2015? There is no current and reliable data on maternal mortality in South Africa available on-line or from any local source. STATSA posted on 27 February 2018, that the under 5-year mortality as of 2016 was 44 deaths per 1,000 live births, which is close to the figure of the MDG4 in September 2015 and since the implementation of the SDGs.<sup>4</sup> The dearth of current national data on these two important targets under SDG3 is worrying and indicate possible loss of focus in accomplishing the targets as adopted by the UN in September 2015.

There is urgent need for all relevant stakeholders to review the country's progress with the various SDGs and especially the healthrelated targets. If not addressed, the failures of the MDGs will be repeated by the SDGs in 2030, when the UN reviews global and individual country's progress. We cannot afford to fail again!

The President welcomed the attendees to the meeting.

#### 2. REGISTRATION OF PROXIES

The CEO duly registered 9 proxies. A quorum was present.

#### 3. THE MINUTES OF THE SIXTY-FIRST ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON 28 OCTOBER 2016

The minutes were adopted and signed. Proposed: Prof Ogunbanjo Seconded: Dr Geduld

#### 6. ANNUAL REPORT OF CEO ON BEHALF OF SENATE FOR THE PERIOD JUNE 2016 TO MAY 2017

The CEO stated that the Annual Report of Senate appeared on pages 22 to 31 of Transactions and reflected the activities of the last financial year.

The reports of the various constituent Colleges appeared on pages 32 to 48.

#### AGREED

The annual report was adopted.

#### 7. RESIGNATION/APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS

Mrs Margie Pollock retired as Financial Director at the end of December 2016. Mr Nel was appointed as the Financial Director in January 2017.

#### 8. FINANCIAL REPORT OF THE HONORARY TREASURER: PROF R N DUNN

The audited financial statements were available on the CMSA website.

Prof Dunn went through his PowerPoint presentation.

Prof Dunn pointed out that on the Profit and Loss Statement, it showed a surplus. The Risk Committee met with the Auditors, who were pleased that the CMSA was a going concern in the short to medium term. The large asset base could accommodate losses.

However, the CMSA was running at an operational loss in terms of examinations. This was not sustainable.

It appeared that the CMSA was doing well financially, as the statements reflected a R2.5 million surplus. However, this was only due to the withdrawing of approximately R4.5 million from a trust (donations) to purchase the Durban property. In reality, the organisation incurred an approximately R2 million loss.

Revenue was approximately R31 million, of which the majority was earned from examinations. Approximately R8 million came from members' contributions.

Approximately R24 million was disbursed on examination expenses. This was for direct examination costs, plus indirect costs incurred by the allocation of expenses of the administration offices.

Investment income of about R2.5 million assisted to keep the CMSA operational.

Whereas in previous years, examination candidate numbers increased (due to the incorporation of MMed candidates), the numbers were stabilising. However, there was a marked increase in the number of candidates registering and paying to write examinations, and then withdrawing.

The CMSA were working on reducing expenses. The accounting software was replaced, and line items were made more specific to assist to clarify where money was spent.

A forecast was compiled for up to the year 2023. Although revenue increased annually at 7%, direct examination costs were estimated to increase by between 7 and 15%. Whereas previously, examination costs such as the venue, secretarial support and catering were sponsored, these costs were now for the CMSA's account.

There was a predicted deficit on examinations in 2023 of R6 million. This included examiner stipends, of which 70% were not claimed. If that amount was excluded, the deficit would still be R3.5 million.

The remedial action instituted included increasing examination fees by an additional 3% over CPI (10% per annum increase).

Direct and indirect examination costs would have to be reduced by 2%. Based on this model, a surplus of around R500,000 was predicted for 2023.

Other interventions included reviewing staff requirements. Voluntary retrenchment packages were offered to staff, which did not exceed budgeted salary costs for the year. This would result in a R1.6 to R2 million saving in the next financial year.

An Educationalist would be appointed. This position would be funded externally.

Prof Dunn asked that those at the meeting take the message back to their constituent Colleges that examination costs needed to be controlled, so as not to result in unmanageable increases in examination or membership fees.

#### THE ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENTS WERE APPROVED.

#### AGREED

The Honorary Treasurer's report was adopted.

#### 9. REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT: PROF M M SATHEKGE

Prof Sathekge stated that there had been continuous improvement in examinations and feedback to registrars.

Prof Sathekge reported on the Board of Directors' decision to allow the carryover of written results, in order for a candidate who failed the oral examination to repeat it without repeating the written component.

The Board of Directors also decided to move the Senate meeting and examinations two weeks apart, in order ensure that there was enough time to check examination results. The recording of oral examinations was also implemented.

Prof Sathekge commented that the projects were still ongoing, and included the HR needs analysis and investigating the registrar failure rate.

The CMSA were in the process of appointing an Educationalist.

The CMSA, SACOMD, HPCSA and NDoH were working together to solve urgent issues, such as those in radiation oncology.

The CMSA were close to signing a bilateral agreement with SACOMD. The two organisations planned to have functional meetings to discuss assessments and each semester's examination results, quality and the way forward. Work based assessments would be considered.

An IMELF satellite meeting was planned for May 2018, where matters of assessment would be discussed. Presidents of African and international Colleges would be invited.

Prof Sathekge spoke about the importance of mentorship.

The report was discussed.

#### ACCLAMATIONS

Prof Sathekge thanked the outgoing Senate and Councils, Board of Directors and Vice Presidents who had done an excellent job in making sure that the CMSA could move forward, and for their constructive input and interaction.

Prof Fagan commended the President for resolving issues that had been on the agenda for a number of years, the intervention in the radiotherapy crisis, the wrapping up of the MoU with SACOMD, the sourcing of funding for the appointment of the Educationalist, and also for bridging the divide between the CMSA and the Registrars.

#### AGREED

The President's report was adopted.

#### 10. REPORT OF CHAIRPERSON, EXAMINATIONS AND CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE (ECC): PROF J VELLEMA

Prof Vellema reported that the ECC dealt with examination processes and ensured reliable, valid and defendable examinations.

Over the previous years, complainants engaged with the Public Protector. Some cases were ongoing, but the process was becoming clearer and easier.

In order to address issues with registrars, the ECC worked hard on clear policies, guidelines and processes, such as for appeals. The CMSA had become a very transparent organisation in terms of exam processes. Despite that, there were still legal issues pending.

A number of workshops were held for examiner training and assessment processes, with international and local speakers presenting.

There had been an improvement in registrar relations, which was partly due to the CMSA roadshows. Upcoming roadshows were planned for Limpopo and the Eastern Cape.

There were changes in the timing of the release of the results for fellowship examinations, which would improve the CMSA's ability to interrogate results.

With regards to the induction of new examiners, the ECC were working on a guideline for the appointment and certification of examiners.

Prof Vellema's report was discussed.

#### COMMENDATION

Prof Sathekge commended Prof Vellema for doing an excellent

job and for making sure that Manco responded to issues timeously. A special note of appreciation was extended to Prof Vellema for her endless commitment and passion to the CMSA in the last 20 years.

Prof Vellema expressed gratitude to Mrs Vorster and the Johannesburg office staff for their commitment relating to examinations.

#### AGREED

The ECC Chairperson's report was adopted.

#### 11. REPORT OF CHAIRMAN, EDUCATION COMMITTEE (EC): DR S AIYER

Prof Bagratee reported on the EC's activities, which included the Mthatha outreach programme, administration of lectureships and scholarships, blueprinting and updating of syllabi. The EC were also engaged in CPD activities.

The highlight of the previous year had been the opening of the new Durban office in Claribel Road. There was a dedication ceremony on 5 April 2017, where the CMSA paid homage and expressed appreciation to two long-standing members: Prof YK Seedat and Dr Clive Daniel. The examination hall was named the YK Seedat Hall and the boardroom was named the Clive Daniel Boardroom.

#### COMMENDATION

Prof Bagratee expressed gratitude to Mrs Sharleen Stone and Mrs Evelyn Naidoo, and thanked the CEO and Senators that attended and supported activities in the Durban offices.

#### AGREED

The EC Chairperson's report was adopted.

#### 12. REPORT OF CHAIRMAN, FINANCE AND GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE (FGPC): PROF G KARIEM

Prof Kariem reported that the FGPC's main focus had been on improving the financial sustainability of the CMSA, which the Honorary Treasurer had reported on.

Prof Kariem stated that policy had been amended to allow constituent Colleges to pay reinstatement penalties for rejoining members, provided that College Councils agreed with a two third majority vote, and that the individual was still liable for the current fees.

With regards to the levy accounts, traditionally they were allocated on a complex sliding scale. This was amended to be a straight 10% of membership fees received. The levy accounts were originally going to provide the funding for the appointment of the Educationalist. However, an external source of funding had been found.

It had been decided that only one Presidential dinner a year would be hosted (in October) due to austerity measures. However, this had not been implemented as yet, due to the visit from the West African College of Physicians in May 2017 and the IMELF satellite meeting in May 2018.

#### COMMENDATION

Prof Kariem gave special thanks to Mr Nel and Prof Dunn for their hard work on the finances.

Prof Sathekge commended the CEO and staff for dedication and hard work throughout the year.

#### AGREED

The FGPC Chairperson's report was adopted.

#### 13. REPORT OF CHAIRMAN, SOCIAL AND ETHICS COMMITTEE (SEC): **PROF B CASSIM**

Prof Cassim reported that all principles in relation to the Social and Ethics committee had been adhered to.

It was noted that training was provided to staff in ethics and security and it was felt that the CMSA needed to adopt a policy on ethics, particularly with regards to conduct on social media.

#### AGREED

The SEC Chairperson's report was adopted.

#### **14. REPORT OF EDITOR OF TRANSACTIONS: PROF G A OGUNBANJO**

Prof Ogunbanjo reported that the July to December 2017 edition would be the last edition to be printed, and all subsequent editions would be electronic only, due to cost implications.

The previous copy of Transactions had cost R80,000, with the July to December 2017 edition costing R103,000 due to the inclusion of the annual reports.

The development of an app for the Transactions Journal was discussed.

#### COMMENDATION

Prof Ogunbanjo thanked Mrs Sharleen Stone, and the Johannesburg and Cape Town offices for their submissions to and work on the Transactions journal.

Prof Ogunbanjo was commended for his work on the publication.

Prof Ogunbanjo acknowledged Prof Sykes' (the Deputy Editor's) help with the Journal.

#### AGREED

The Editor's report was adopted.

### KM Seedat Memorial Lectureship Social Determinants of Health in South Africa – Time For Action

My sincere thanks and gratitude is extended to the Local and African Organising Committee of the 5<sup>th</sup> Wonca Africa 20<sup>th</sup> National Family Practitioners Conference for affording me the privilege and honour to deliver the prestigious annual KM Seedat Memorial Lecture for 2017.

It is indeed a singular honour and privilege to attempt to walk in the shadow of such a distinguished social scientist, family physician and philanthropist who contributed so much in social and health engineering during his lifetime (1897-1997).

My first reaction on hearing that the theme for this year's conference would be "Social Determinants for Health – Time for Action" was: "Oh no! Surely this is déjà vu", considering that this topic had been deliberated upon so many times by so many stakeholders *(local, national and international)* to the point of exhaustion over the last three decades.

I recall that each of these had culminated in a plan of action, however, we are yet to see the fruits of such deliberations.

In my humble view, the time for action has long past, and we are now into "added time or referee's time" as the football pundits would call a game of soccer which appears to be heading for a stalemate.

Indeed, significant stakeholders in health care especially in South Africa viz. providers and receivers of care, have bemoaned the lack of progress or action at the coal face where health care is delivered.

Patience is running out and the clamour is growing for health care activists to rise and be counted in the battle for meaningful changes within the health care system and for receivers of care to benefit from the much-yearned outcomes in health care.

Since 2008, many reports have been published reflecting on the state of health in developing countries including those in Africa.

The World Health Organization (*WHO*) published its report in 2008 during the  $30^{\text{th}}$  anniversary of Alma Ata<sup>1</sup>; this landmark publication endorsed the concept of Primary Health Care being delivered within

a patient centred health care system, and emphatically proclaimed that it would influence health advocacy, improve health inequities, and make health authorities more accountable.

The SA Health Review (2008) <sup>2</sup> commented that the South African health care system had <u>become weaker</u> when compared to the 1990s, and attributed this to the following factors:

- 1. Inter-provincial disparities and inequity between private and public sectors as well as between rural and urban compartments.
- 2. The skills mix being insufficient, poor support structures and challenges within facilities.
- 3. Lack of equipment provision and poor management structures.

The review called for creative strategies within both sectors to address these inequities and challenges.

The Lancet in its much-publicised and widely-acclaimed landmark publication in 2009 and subsequent publications in 2012, commented on the emergence of 4 colliding epidemics in South Africa *(HIV, TB, Non-communicable diseases, and Trauma)* and their negative impact on health outcomes.<sup>3-7</sup>

South Africa has a weak and inequitable health care system despite spending 8.7% of the gross domestic product on health care *(more than any other country in Africa)*. The authors identified a number of challenges and made recommendations to the authorities on possible improvements to the system.

The current perception by many stakeholders is that these epidemics have not only collided with each other but have coalesced to create a "tsunami" of epidemics, thus adding to the current cumulative burden of disease and burden of care.

In 2011, Health 24, a publication of the Health Professions Council of South Africa (*HPCSA*) published a stinging critique on policy makers and health officials related to the ongoing exodus of health professionals from South Africa (*including doctors, nurses and the allied professions*).

<sup>7</sup> It has been estimated that only 50% of the total number of medical doctors *(37333)* registered with the HPCSA in 2011 currently remain and practise in this country.

The main countries that appear to have benefited from this dynamic exodus include the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and Canada.

A number of push factors were identified especially in the public sector; these included poor working conditions, long working hours, poor salaries and lack of incentives, freezing of public sector posts, lack of consultant posts and inadequate supervision of junior colleagues.

This disturbing scenario has the potential of seriously damaging our health care system because it impacts on the required ratio of health care workers per patient population, training and supervision of junior workers, standards of health care and morbidity and mortality.

A study conducted in 2008 ranked the different health care systems across the world based on access to health care and quality of health outcomes.

<sup>8</sup> Disturbingly and paradoxically, South Africa featured twice simply because of the current reality that there are 2 operating systems providing health care in parallel in this country viz. private versus public health care system operating side by side.

Ironically, South Africa featured amongst the best by virtue of the highly rated private sector component (where the quality of health care is of a very high standard and comparable with any first world country), and it also featured amongst the worst because of the shambolic public health care system.

South Africans warmed to our newly appointed National Minister of Health *(in his Rubicon speech on 13 April 2010)* when he identified with and lamented the damaging data published on the state of health in South Africa and promised to tackle head-on all challenges facing our health care system.

<sup>9</sup> In this major budget speech, he enunciated a strategic health plan with a number of key priorities linked to millennium developmental goals already identified by the World Health Organization.

Primary Health Care was again identified as the priority programme in driving this agenda, and the District Health Care System was chosen as the vehicle to deliver on long-anticipated health care outcomes desired by the majority of end users of the system.

The commission on social determinants of health *(appointed by the World Health Organization in 2010)* provided developing countries with a useful conceptual framework to tackle gaps in health care systems and improve health equity by focussing on social determinants of health.

<sup>10</sup> It recommended a context-specific strategy that must include a dynamic interplay between macro-environmental issues:

- 1. Such as broad public health care policy, provision of housing and improving access to water, ownership of land, decent housing, sanitation and access to food and nutrition
- Micro-environmental issues such as living and working conditions, personal behaviours, personal mental and physical health as well as lifestyle issues that impact on health.

Any cross-sectional situational analysis of the current state of health care in our country will reveal alarming statistics.

We appear to have improved only in a few isolated fields such as:

- 1. HIV awareness and access to anti-retroviral drugs.
- 2. Educational and awareness strategies addressing harmful effects of cigarette smoking and alcohol usage.
- 3. Imminent proclamation of a National Health Insurance Act.

Sadly, the negatives appear to outweigh and overshadow any gains emanating from the above-mentioned strategies, and the majority of South Africans across any spectrum *(political or socio-economic)* remain pessimistic about future health care provision for themselves and their families.

In summary therefore, it is clear that we are still currently saddled with an over-burdened, under-resourced, fragmented and collapsing public health care system serving more than 60% of communities on the one hand, and which paradoxically co-exists with an over-resourced, unsustainable, high-tech self-destructive private health care system that caters for the health care needs of only 30% of the population.

The current private health care system based on invoice has also been denounced in dramatic terms as legalised corruption.

Generally speaking, it is widely perceived that curative care overshadows any attempt at preventive care.

Economists and actuaries continue to label the current system as very expensive, cost-ineffective and a heavy drain on our economy.

They claim that any plans on the table at present will have minimal positive impact on narrowing gaps related to equity, health outcomes and millennium development goals.

The proposed National Health Insurance Act remains a pipeline dream for the majority of South Africans, and only time will tell if it becomes a reality and achieves the desired outcomes for all people living in this country.

I am hopeful that the swell of public opinion and agitation from the majority of health care workers *(including medical doctors, nurses, and paramedical workers)* in both public and private sectors will grow into a sizeable meaningful force for change.

We must continue to agitate for an improved system based on the principles of Alma Ata (2008).

I am also hopeful that all you will converge in endorsing a proposed Pretoria Declaration by virtue of you being present at this conference in Pretoria today (20 August 2017).

The Pretoria Declaration 2017 <u>must of necessity</u> include the following key elements and principles:

1. A systematic country-wide review of Human Health Resources must be undertaken.

- The current policy must be strengthened to fill all vacant or frozen posts with the correct personnel selected on merit.
- Only those with the correct skills mix irrespective of colour, race, creed, status or connections must be employed and held accountable in terms of executing their mandates efficiently and effectively.
- 4. Generalists must take their rightful place in the hierarchy of health care delivery.
- The critical mass of generalist doctors currently working in both private and public sectors (over 20 000 currently registered) must be consolidated into one working mass and harnessed into the future proposed National Health Insurance system.
- 6. All generalists (meeting minimum acceptable criteria such as active participation in continuing medical education programmes) should be translated into the new generalist category called Family Physicians. (This strategy is similar to what transpired in the United Kingdom when its National Health System was first established).
- Negotiations must be kick-started to integrate these doctors into a capitation system similar to the system operating in the United Kingdom.
- At present, the category of Family Physician seems to resonate only with public service appointments in terms of remuneration and career pathways.
- 9. Family Physicians are currently not reimbursed appropriately in the private sector although they are registered by the Health Professions Council into the category of Specialist Family Physician.
- 10. Chronic care patients *(fulfilling the criteria for Prescribed Minimum Benefits)* must be decongested systematically from public health facilities to private generalists who have been capitated.

- The referral pathway as enunciated in the District Health Care and the Norms and Standards Packages must be respected and adhered to by all stakeholders including endusers.
- Incentives and a conducive work environment must be created so that emigrant health care workers return and bolster the current failing system.
- Graft and greed pervasive in the current system must be eradicated at every level of the proposed health care system.
- 14. Transparency and whistle-blowing must be encouraged by policy makers and facility managers.
- 15. A smart health card *(similar to the current new identity card, and which is widely used in many other countries such as Australia)* must be introduced for all clients using the health care system *(public or private)*. This strategy will go a long way in streamlining access and standardised health care at the point of entry, and avoid unnecessary duplication of care and wasted costs.

### **Obituary: Professor A M Segone**

Professor A M Segone was born in Kokosi, Fochville. He attended the Secondary School in Polokwane. He then received a Scholarship to Fort Hare where he undertook a BSc Degree in Chemistry and Zoology. He passed the BSc Degree with a distinction in Chemistry. He then went to Wentworth Medical School KZN for six months.

Whilst in Wentworth, Prof. Segone received another scholarship to go and study medicine in the University of Sheffield, UK. After obtaining the MB ChB degree in Sheffield, he trained as a General Surgeon in Manchester which culminated into the Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (FRCS) diploma. It was during his training in General Surgery that he gained an interest in Urology. Prof. Segone's training in Urology was done at the Institute of Urology and at the Central Middlesex Hospital in London,UK.

After working as a Consultant Urologist in Liverpool (UK) and Harare (Zimbabwe), Prof. Segone came back home in 1992. He was Professor of Urology at the Dr George Mukhari Academic Hospital and Medunsa (now Sefako Makgatho Health Science University) from 1994 to 2008 and then continued to work as Consultant/Specialist in the Department of Urology until May 2017.

He played a role in the establishment of Sefako Makgatho Health Sciences University as part of the Interim Council. He has served on various boards of different institution such as the CMSA, Correctional Services and the Forum of Statutory Health Councils of South Africa etc.

### Criteria for CMSA Endorsement of CPD Activities

- 1. The CPD activity and its content will have to meet the approval of the relevant College council and considered to be of a standard that will enhance the image of that College.
- 2. The organizer of the CPD activity should ideally be a member of the CMSA in good standing.
- 3. The constituent College must take full responsibility for the completion of the CPD accreditation application. Any CMSA membership discount to be noted under "Registration Fee involved for participants" on the CPD 2A Form.
- 4. The CPD activities should primarily be run under the banner of the constituent College of the CMSA. Due restraint should be exercised by the respective college ensuring that engagement in partnerships with organizations and entities in CPD activities remain appropriate and in keeping with the standing of the CMSA.
- 5. The constituent Colleges of the CMSA should not associate themselves with CPD activities of commercial entities related to product launches or product specific CPD activities.
- 6. Sponsorships of these CPD activities are permissible provided that the principles as set out below are closely adhered to:
  - a. The names of the sponsors should not be included in the title of the CPD activity.
  - b. The sponsor may be acknowledged as a sponsor on the advert/notification and on the programme for the CPD activity but no advertising of the commercial entities products should appear on either of these documents.
  - c. The mailing of adverts/notifications of the CPD activities may however be accompanied by product literature separated from and not incorporated in the notification/advert of the CPD activity.
  - d. No product promotion is allowed within the CPD meeting room but company-branded items and promotional material may be displayed in a separate area that should not be accessible to the general public if the products are not allowed to be advertised to the public.
  - e. In addition to the above, the sponsored activities should strictly adhere to the code pertaining to marketing and promotions to healthcare professionals as set out by the Marketing Code Authority.

- 7. The determination of the Risk and Profit split remains within the discretion of each individual college in consultation with the organisers of the activity. The overall principle that Risk Share follows Profit Share must apply.
- 8. However, the main thrust of running CPD activities under the auspices of the

CMSA and its constituent Colleges remains most importantly the provision of benefits for ongoing membership of the CMSA, the enhancement of the overall image of constituent College and the CMSA and not the generation of additional income.

A benefit in the form of a meaningful discount for the CPD activity registration fee for CMSA members in good standing should take preference over profit sharing and remain the chief consideration.

This was a very important motivation for extending free CPD accreditation originally.

- 9. On completion of the activity the organisers of the CPD activity must provide the College with a final assessment by the participants with the minimum of the following points to be covered:
  - a. Content
  - b. Presentation
  - c. Organisation / Administration
  - d. Venue
  - e. Overall value
